These are the recommendations that came from the survey

- 1. There should be Premier Division and a Championship League
- 2. Triples League should be disbanded
- Singles should be dropped from Championship League
- Championship League to comprise teams of six (6) players, playing Fours and Pairs in the morning and 2 bowl triples in the afternoon
- All disciplines in both Premier and Championship League should be played in the same conditions as for Centre. 21 shots for singles, 16 ends for Pairs, Fours and 2 bowls Triples

Update on our greens

Members are aware the board has been concerned to ensure the new greens have adequate drainage after conversion to synthetic. The board some 8/9 years ago ensured that drainage from green 3 would cope with heavy rains. Rains are forecast to be even heavier now and the warning recently from Napier was that power can also fail simultaneously. Accordingly, the planned drainage for green 3 will be extended so that any overflow from the green 3 soak hole will be connected to the 150mm drainage pipe which will service the conversion to take place on green 2. This in turn will connect to a 150mm pipe to run down beside the concrete path adjacent to the western side of green 1 and connect to the council storm water at our north/western boundary.

Commencing Monday 15th February (weather permitting!!) Armstrong Plumbing will be commencing this project and though all care will be taken there will be some inconvenience to members for the 5/6 working days this will take. I'm sure we will all cope with this.
