Can you solve the mystery?

A lady from England sent us a message about spoons her mother had received from a penpal in NZ. The spoon and knife were then sent to the club. Here are the messages that we received.

If you can throw any light on who may have sent them, please let us know.

Hi

I have a commemorative spoon and I think knife? Sent to my Mum form her pen pal in New Zealand probably in the 70s or 80s. As you can see in the photos they are from the Matua Women's bowling club Tauranga. Mum has passed and I wondered if they were of any interest to anyone there . I would happily send (free). They aren't silver or anything but thought someone might want as memorabilia

I can tell you that – Mum was Jean Barnett, she died about a year ago aged 96, and her pen pal was June I think Marlowe – married name Read. I think her husband was called Arthur and they lived in Mosgiel and then Matua (I think Arthur remarried after June died – Kathleen). June and Arthur had a son called Christopher and a daughter Gena. Gena married Ross Campbell and the last address I have for them is Tauranga. I assume June might have been a member of the Women's bowling club – Mum collected spoons so she often sent her them. This time she also included this small knife (butter knife?). I enclose a picture of June Marlowe who I think became June Read. I don't know how it started (possibly through school or college?) but they corresponded for many years – certainly they were corresponding early enough for June to send Mum a Christmas card in 1947. I remember getting presents from New Zealand as a child and Mum talking about Gena and Christopher and sending them presents. Mum also has an address for Marlowe in Dunedin which may have been for June's parents. Mum always wanted to visit her in New Zealand. Mum was a great traveller (I lost track a bit) but I don't think she ever managed that.
