

Letter sent to Berry Services from the Club and the reply they received in Red

Hello Steven,

Some of our members can be very vocal about how we manage our greens installed by BBS, so a note from you would be greatly appreciated.

- 1. I know that you advised us to roll the green occasionally when it's wet. We have not done that yet but intend to when we can get our hands on a roller. How often should a green be rolled? We would not want to overdo it. Yes, it doesn't do any harm to roll the green a couple of times a year, or when necessary to help with the speed of the green. The surface should be damp, not flooded, and always roll with the direction of the seams or on a diagonal. Do not roll across the seams as this will cause stress on the stitching and may break some of them. Roll slowly and no sudden starts or stops or sharp turns.
- 2. We have occasionally been spraying the green with detergent. Do we continue to do this?

 As and when necessary if you get ponding. This is caused by surface tension in the fiber's and they lock up not letting water through. Just like washing a car, it pays to wash the green to flush the airborne contaminants through.
- 3. Some members think the greens should be stretched as they are not quite as fast as we hoped. Others say no, leave them as they are. Some guidance here would be appreciated.
 Not recommended as you might gain 1 sec but that's about all, and not worth the expense of doing it. It also can cause stress issues on the seams as well. Rolling the green will give you a better result.
- 4. Lastly, we would appreciate a visit from you next time you are in NZ and have a few available hours. Not a problem, maybe towards the end of the month.

We are generally delighted with our greens and appreciate the contribution Berry's have made to get them to where they are.
